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#### Four Teams Compete for Daly Building Project

On July 9, 2018, OP3 received three Statements of Qualifications (SOQs) to the RFAP-Q, in addition to the original unsolicited proposal submitted for the rehabilitation of the Henry J. Daly Building, the current headquarters for the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD). Following the District's evaluation of the SOQs, the District will prequalify a number of teams, who will be the only shortlisted proposers invited to participate in a subsequent Request for Alternative Proposal (RFAP) process. #### Mayor Bowser Creates Green Bank

On July 10, 2018, Mayor Muriel Bowser signed into law the <u>District of Columbia Green Finance</u> <u>Authority Establishment Act</u>, officially making Washington, DC the first city in the United States to establish a green bank. The new entity will leverage public funds to encourage private investment in sustainable infrastructure ranging from renewable energy and efficiency projects to water management systems and clean transportation. OP3 looks forward to serving on the board of the green bank and partnering with it to achieve the District's sustainability goals.
